# **MAY 2021 BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS**

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors of McLeod Cooperative Power Association was held on May 25, 2021 at McLeod Co-op headquarters. All nine board members, the attorney, CEO Ron Meier, and department managers participated in the meeting.

Highlights of the meeting included:

- The outage report for the month of April 2021 was provided with a total of 74 outages, affecting 152 consumers.
- The tentative Annual Meeting Schedule was provided. Members attending the meeting will receive a \$10 bill credit. A grab-and-go boxed lunch will be provided at the end of the meeting. Members will be requested to RSVP if they plan on attending.
- A motion was carried to approve the Annual Meeting Notice.
- A motion was carried to approve the action of the 2021 Nominating Committee for Districts 4, 5, and 6.
- Finance Manager Steph Jakel presented the Operating Statement and Balance Sheet for the month of April 2021.
- The Audit Committee reported on their review of the April expenditures.
- A motion was carried to approve the changes to industrial Rate #25.
- An update was provided on the Energy Conservation and Optimization (ECO) Act that was passed by the State Legislature. The ECO Act makes smart improvements to our state's energy efficiency program by supporting a greater range of technology and fuel choices available to Minnesotans.



**Doug Kirtz** 

Doug is currently the District 4 director and the board president. He is a life-long member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Arlington. Gary is retired from driving a school bus for the Sibley East School District. He has served as a Green Isle Township Supervisor for 24 years, a board member for the MN Association of Townships, and a trustee for the MN Association of Townships Insurance Trust. Gary has served on the Governor's Clean Water Council. He has experience working with elected officials at the state and federal level advocating for electrical cooperatives. Gary would like to work together with the current board and management team to ensure our Co-op continues to run smoothly. He feels that it is very important to stay in tune with local, and particularly rural, needs. One of Gary's priorities is for the Co-op to focus on providing reliable service to its members.

Following these assignments respectively, he served in the Pentagon on the Army (2002-2004) and Department of Defense (DoD) (2008-2010) Staffs – working with large, complex organizations delivering high-quality, meaningful outcomes. Karl gained a detailed understanding of power generation, transmission, distribution, and renewable energy sources as a Ph.D. student and Postdoctoral Research Associate at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He worked as a Director at Open Systems International (specializing in power system control room software, 2019-2020, Medina MN). He is a licensed Professional Engineer. Karl's interest in serving the community by understanding current power needs throughout District 5, anticipating future requirements in a rapidly evolving energy delivery landscape, and working in concert with the McLeod Co-op Power staff to continue exceptional power delivery to all cooperative members – rural and urban.


