NEW PAYMENT OPTIONS AND EASY ONLINE ACCOUNT ACCESS LAUNCHING JULY 12

On July 12, McLeod Co-op Power is launching three new payment options for members. The goal is make it more convenient for members to pay their bills.

1. Secure Credit Card Payments by Phone Payments made over the phone will now go through an automated phone service for enhanced security.

2. One Time Online Payments with PayNow Members that want to make a quick, one time payment without logging into SmartHub will now have that option on the Cooperative's website.


3. Online and Mobile SmartHub Application SmartHub – an optional online service that

offers members a faster, more efficient way to pay their bills and manage account information from either a computer or mobile device, including smartphones and tablets. The SmartHub app is free (available for both Apple/IOS and Android mobile devices) to download and install, and is powered by the National Information Solutions Cooperative (NISC), which developed and services the program.



CEO MESSAGE

There is no doubt summer has arrived, bringing a heat wave earlier than most of us expected. When I turned on my air conditioner for the first time in early June, I knew it was just too soon.

You are already hearing stories about the hot weather putting stress on the electrical grid here in Minnesota and across the nation. During the recent extreme heat our wholesale power supplier, Great River Energy, called on our load reduction programs (aka demand response) to help reduce the stress on the system.

There are over 200,000 residents served by Great River Energy that participate in demand response programs. These members allow their air conditioners, water heaters, or other loads to be cycled or controlled for a period of time on high-demand days. Because of this, Great River Energy can reduce its peak load by 15%. Members who enroll in our demand response programs receive a credit or reduced rate on their bill. When the electrical system starts to get stressed, there is another aspect that starts to respond, price. Much like we saw prices increasing in the wholesale electricity markets during the polar vortex that impacted Texas earlier in the year, prices can also rise during unexpected heatwaves. We look to Great River Energy to help manage these price changes by balancing their purchases and sales into the market with their generation fleet and

demand response programs. In the end, Great River Energy is doing everything they can to get the best pricing to their members while delivering safe and reliable power to our area so that we can deliver it to your homes.

On another note, if you haven't heard already, our Annual Meeting is scheduled for July 13. We are going to be at the Hutchinson Event Center again. It will be my second meeting as your CEO, and I am looking forward to reflecting on my first year at the Cooperative while celebrating all the good work of your employees during the trying year of 2020. We ask that you RSVP for the meeting so we can better prepare, but if you forget, we will have some extra food just in case.

As we move into the future, there are going to be events that challenge us, as there always has. Our employees and our partners are always planning and preparing for the challenges. It got hot early this year, but we handled it. Let's see what is next.

JUNE 2021 BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors of McLeod Cooperative Power Association was held on June 22, 2021, at McLeod Co-op headquarters. All nine board members, the attorney, CEO Ron Meier, and department managers participated in the meeting.

Highlights of the meeting included:

- The outage report for May 2021 was reviewed with a total of 53 outages, affecting 223 consumers.
- The line crew changed out 26 reject poles in May. Crews also continued to perform substation checks, yard lights, and transformer change-outs.
- Line crews completed pole top and bucket rescue training on May 19.
- Star Energy and the engineering staff are finalizing the new 4-year work plan, which includes the Bell Substation that will be rebuilt.
- A motion was carried to approve the minor change to office hours on Policy 3-1 Schedule of Charges being 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (Monday-Friday).
- It was reported that Adolfson & Peterson will be conducting the 10-month walk-through of the new facility on July 1.
- IT Manager, Eric Sell, reported that the Coop is working with a vendor to add another layer of cybersecurity to prevent malicious interactions with websites and other internet communications.
- SmartHub live date is scheduled for July 12. The IT and Billing Department have been busing with the administrative set-up. Testing will continue in the final weeks to ensure the payment gateways are fully integrated.
- Finance Manager, Steph Jakel, presented the Operating Statement and Balance Sheet for May 2021 for review.

SAFETY FIRST: DO NOT REMOVE YOUR METER WITHOUT CO-OP ASSISTANCE

Electricians and/or members are not authorized to pull an electric meter to perform work on a service.

Electrical safety is a primary concern for McLeod Co-op Power. Removing or adjusting electrical equipment carries the potential to harm yourself and others. In attempt to prevent these risks, we stress the importance of never cutting the seal, tampering with, or removing a meter for any reason without the assistance from the Co-op.

Our policy <u>requires</u> a trained co-op employee, using the proper protective equipment, to pull and reinstall any energized meter. McLeod Co-op Power provides this service during regular business hours for a fee of \$85. A notice of two business days is requested, so coordinate your work needs with our team in advance by calling (800) 494-6272 during business hours (Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m.- 4:00 p.m.).

WARNING: If an electrician or member does pull an electric meter to disconnect a service, significantly higher fees will incur. Disconnection or tampering of a meter sends a power outage alarm to the co-op. If a line crew responds to the outage, the member will be billed at the applicable line crew service call rate of \$310 during business hours, \$465 on evenings or Saturdays, and \$620 on a Sunday or holiday.

Your cooperation is appreciated. Our only goal is to protect you, your neighbors and our line workers from possible injury.





Most people expect higher energy costs in the summer. We crank up the air conditioning; the kids are home from school playing video games and creating extra loads of laundry full of bathing suits, beach towels, and muddy clothes. Warm weather comes with a price but, with a little preparation, you can manage your energy use wisely and cut down on your bill. This month we asked McLeod Co-op Power's Energy Management Specialist, Justin Kohls, to share his best tips for saving energy this summer.

Check Your Air Conditioning

Your air conditioner requires regular maintenance to function efficiently throughout its years of service. Neglecting necessary maintenance ensures poor performance and unnecessarily high energy use. Checking the coils, fins, evaporative cooler, and heat pump may require the services of a professional.

Replace Your Air Filter

Replacing your air filter is one of the easiest and most effective things you can do to make sure that your A/C runs smoothly and efficiently. Clogged, dirty filters block normal airflow and reduce your air conditioner's ability to absorb heat.

Use Your Thermostat Wisely

Set your thermostat as high as comfortably possible in the summer, ideally 78°F or higher. Every degree of extra cooling will increase energy usage six to eight percent. Keep your house warmer than normal when your family is away, and lower the temperature only when people are at home.

Avoid the Oven

Cooking with a conventional oven can add unwanted heat to your house, forcing your A/C to work harder. Do more of your cooking with a microwave or slow cooker to keep the kitchen cool. Better yet, use the summer heat as an excuse to fire up the backyard grill.

If You Aren't Using It, Unplug It

From your computer to your toaster, all electronics generate heat. Even if it's switched off, just being plugged in generates a small amount of heat in the wiring. Too keep things cool, unplug any electronics you're not using. It's not much per device, but add up all the gizmos in your home, and it can make a few degrees difference.

Seal Your Home

Insulation isn't just for the cold winter months. Preventing air leaks is one of the best ways to keep warm air out and cool air in. Simple caulking and weather-stripping can save up to 30 percent on heating and cooling costs.

Wash with Cold or Warm Water

Avoid using hot water whenever possible. Because 90% of the energy used by your washing machine goes toward heating the water, doing your laundry on either the cold or the warm cycle will save you a tremendous amount of electricity.

"Energy savings isn't just a summertime activity. Many of these tips will save you money all year long. Air stripping, insulated curtains, and intelligent thermostat usage will keep your home cool in the summer and warm in the winter. Creating smart energy habits will reduce waste, improve efficiency, and save you money on your energy bill year round," Justin shared. "In addition to these simple adjustments, McLeod Co-op Power offers a variety of energy saving programs to help you manage your energy use and help keep electric costs low."

HOT WATER SAVINGS!

If your monthly utility bills have got you in hot water, McLeod Co-op Power can save members money on monthly electrical bills with Stored Water Heating and Peak Shave Water Heating.



By finding ways for members to use inexpensive off-peak electricity, you save money on your bills and we lower our wholesale power costs.

STORED WATER HEATING

A stored water heating system heats water every night when members use less electricity and wholesale energy costs are lower, then stores enough hot water for use during the day. Members pay a reduced energy rate for participating in the program and rebates for enrollment are available. You must have an 100+ gallon water heater or 80 gallon water heater with a mixing valve in order to participate. A Marathon Water Heater, available through McLeod Co-op, is a great high efficiency water heater to pair with the Stored Water Heating Program.

PEAK SHAVE WATER HEATING

The Peak Shave Water Heating Program is designed to reduce demand on the electrical system on days of high demand and peak pricing (typically the hottest or coldest days of each month) or in the case of a system emergency. By allowing McLeod to control your water heater during these peak periods you ultimately help keep our retail energy rates low. Water heaters enrolled on this program are only controlled on peak days. Members receive a credit of \$5.00 per month to be on the Peak Shave Water Heating Program. You must have a 80 gallon or larger water heater that is at least 90% efficient to qualify for the rebate.
